Training Committee Report

I am proud to report that our only IDNR Hunter Safety Field Day class we offer this year was a tremendous success. Due to the virus and requirements by the Park District we were limited in the size of the class we could have. We had 30 students with their parents and grandparents, registered. We had two "no-shows," but "4 walk in's." These students who walked in drove from Paris, II. and Rockford II. just to be here. I found out later that we were the only class within 5 counties in the northern portion of the state offering the class.

I admit, we were a little over, but I could not refuse to service the kids and their parents for putting in such an effort to participate. I joined the entire class outside for introductions and broke the class into three portions for the entire day's education and exercises. This new system worked very well. This classes scored the highest test scores for this year in the Field Day Program for the state. I place full credit on Jim C, Ralph N, Dave K, Taylor Roe, and Mike Q for their professional and exceptional help. I thank the Club membership and the Park District for working out the virus issues and providing their support. (See photos)

<u>Fírearm Safety Corner</u>

The figures are coming in and the ISRA is reporting record gun sales again for this year with over 8 million guns sold. The NRA estimates 40% of those sales are new gun owners. I think we all know the reasons why law-abiding citizens are purchasing them, and I do not want to go into that here. I do suggest that if you know of your neighbors, family and friends who are in this category, offer them help. Take them to a range. Instruct them on gun safety and storage. I even offer my business card to send them a general outline and resource materials they can research for themselves. We are all a part of a community of law-abiding gun owners who cherish our Second Amendment. With the ownership, is responsibility for ourselves, our families, our friends and neighbors. The primary objective, to keep everyone safe in that ownership.

There is one subject that folks keep questioning me on. The "What If They," questions. It is very simple in Illinois. If you can avoid a situation, do it as safe as it permits. The gun can **ONLY** be presented under the threat of imminent danger, great bodily harm, and or death. You as the "Reasonable Person," is named in the law to do so. This is a generic answer for gun owners who have not taken a Conceal Carry Class and should be confirmed with your attorney. No reasonable, responsible person wants to shoot anyone if it can be avoided. Another answer is your life has value, as that of your family and friends. Criminals surrender that value and rights in their criminal actions against you and yours.

In closing I viewed a comment that stated, The violent left is now wanting to target the rural and suburban communities in our country. Food for thought we are the ones who own all the ammo that is hard to come by right now. Note: FYI Ammo is available in Missouri, Wisconsin, and southern Indiana for sale in person. Hard to find around major metro areas.

After completing our recent Hunter Safety Field Day Class held at the Naperville Sportsman's' Club on September 5, 2020, I wish to report the following:

Due to the Corvid-19 pandemic our usual class schedule was cut from three classes per year to one. Working with the Naperville Park District and our club staff, (our hosts) we were able to create a format that would allow us to provide a Field Day Class. Using formats that where developed from my mentor instructors from the past and the current group of instructors that provide this service; we came up with a unique teaching tool and format. We took the format of dividing the class into groups and assigning instructors to each group to cover the class materials and exercises in smaller numbers with better one on one communication and hands on access. The groups were separated after introductions outside, and masked Each smaller group covered specific items and practiced those learned skills. After completing that groups' material, the groups would switch with another instructor, and cover the next batch of materials and exercises. Dividing the class into three groups in three different areas, has proven to be the best format.

Using this format has increased test scores, and the parents just loved it. Many parents have complimented our instructor staff and myself as a result. I have been receiving many e-mails after the class from those parents. Many thanking us for giving them the access to a Field Day Event, and the format and instructors we have. This format has also decreased the actual time required to perform the classes from over 9-10 hours to about 8 hours with breaks, lunch, and review before testing. You should remember that most of our students are very young and some of the skills we install in them take time.


Specific Points:	
Average Test Score for the Class	95.3%
Average Test Age	10.9 years old
Highest Test Age	14.4 years old
Youngest Test Age	9.2 years old

In closing I wish to state that this format works better than the old ways. The students like it, the test scores prove it, and the parents just loved it. I would also like to take this time to thank each Instructor: David Krause, Taylor Roe, Mike Quill, Dave (our Naperville Park District Rep), Jim and Ralph, (our club members) and the Naperville Sportsman's Club. Without them this could not have happened. Their skills, dedication, resources, and belief in what we do need to be acknowledged. I am truly humbled and honored to work with a truly gifted, and talented bunch of friends.
