

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Naperville Sportsman's Club (Club) is dedicated to preserving our community's outdoor heritage and the conservation of its natural resources. The Club promotes shotgun shooting sports with an emphasis on safety, education, and recreation. We promote the use of non-toxic shotgun shells and biodegradable targets.

Incorporated in 1937, the Club is a legacy of Naperville gun clubs dating back to the 1880s. Sportsman's Park is owned by the City, leased to the Park District and operated with help from the Club, which is responsible for much of the range's programming.

The range offers American Trap for guests who know how to shoot. In addition to weekly "open" shooting, the Club offers seasonal leagues, members' shoots as well as "registered" targets through the Amateur Trapshooting Association (ATA).

Beginner instructional programs are available through the Park District.

FACILITIES

The range is **15 fenced acres** within **Sportsman's Park**, offering lighted fields housing automatic traps throwing singles, doubles and wobbles targets from 16–27-yard distances, with an additional 35-yard line for game shooting.

Sportsman's clubhouse offers central heat and air, a wood burning fireplace, with ADA access and newly remodeled restrooms for men and women.

BENEFITS

Members receive discounted shooting fees, ID badges, e-newsletters, as well as preferred pricing on shooting equipment and supplies. New probationary members must be sponsored by an existing Club member.

RANGE RULES

FOID Cards*, Steel Shot Ammo, Eye & Ear Protection REQUIRED.

Actions open and empty. Fingers off triggers. Muzzles pointed in a safe direction. One shell in the chamber, sole exception -Doubles Trap.

* Some narrow exceptions allowed

FIREARMS

You are responsible for providing your own shotgun and knowing how to operate it. We do not rent firearms. Shotguns must be 12 gauge or smaller.

Appropriate firearms can be target or field shotguns with modified or tighter chokes. Shotguns may have repeating, self-loading or a break-type action.

Short-barreled "coach" guns or home defense-type pump shotguns are not appropriate for use in trapshooting.

AMMUNITION

By Best Management Practices and City ordinance, the range requires **ONLY steel shot** ammunition in a **target load equivalent**. No shot larger than #6 Steel allowed.
